Glue

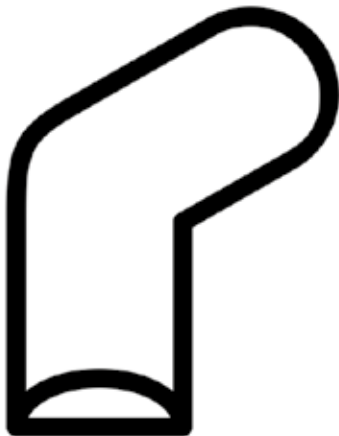
Anything else you can find to make a cool character

### What you need to do:

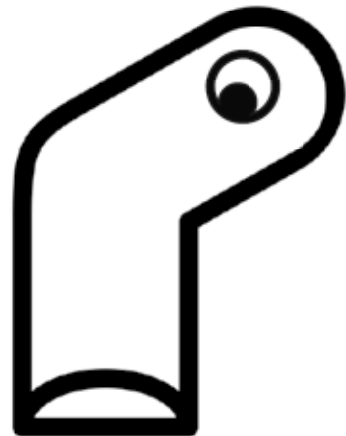
1. Take an old sock and put your hand inside

3. Make it a unique character with a tongue or a little hat or whatever else you can find.



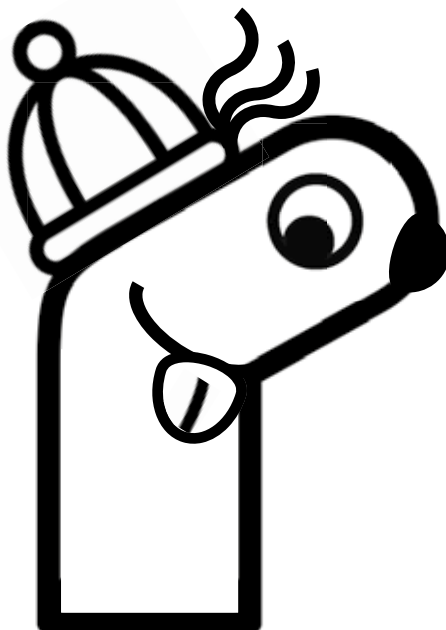

### What you need:

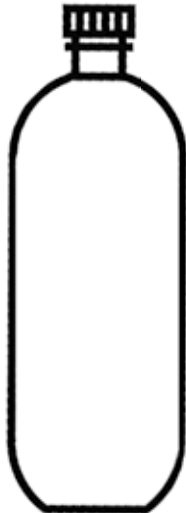
2 empty plastic bottles

## NORTHERN TERRITORY



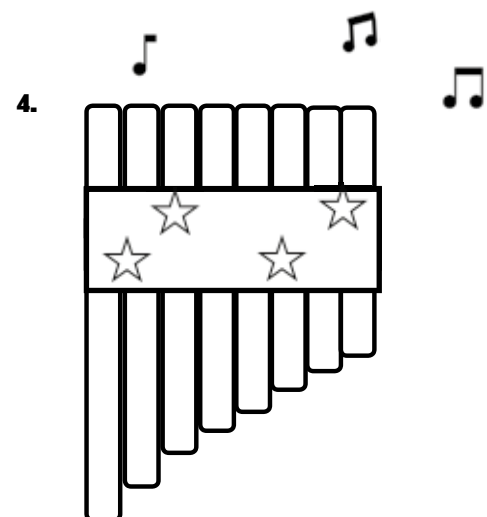
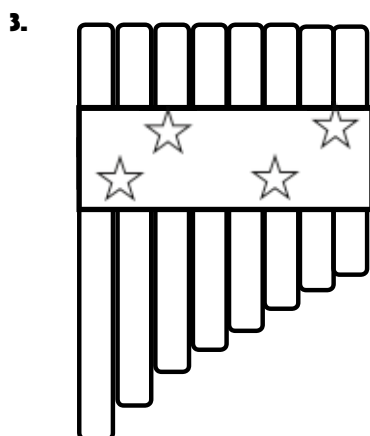
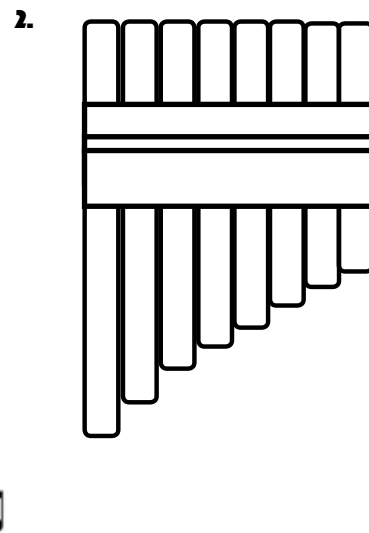
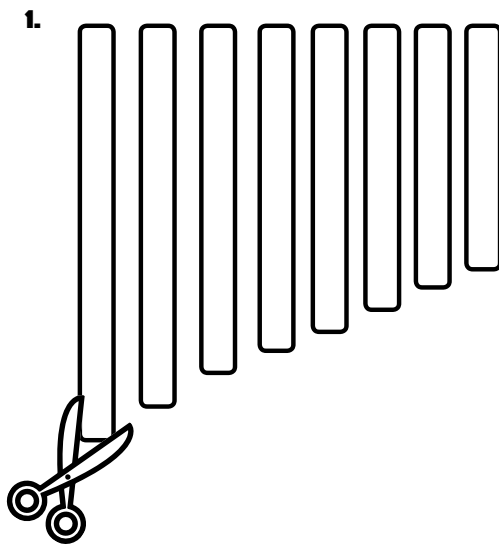

### What you need:

8 straws  
Sticky tape  
Scissors  
Stickers or paints for decoration

1. With the help of an adult, cut the 8 straws into different lengths.
2. In order from shortest to tallest, tape the straws together in a line.
3. Now decorate it in your own special way.
4. Ready? Blow into the straws one-by-one to make some cool tunes.

## GREECE

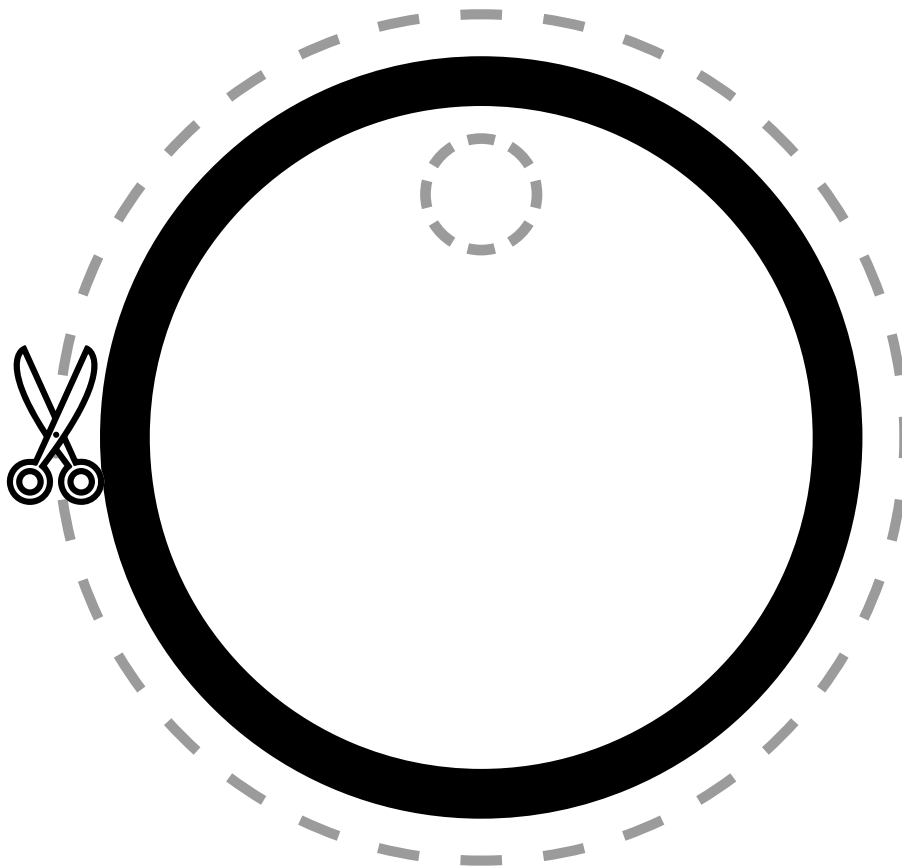

3. Make a hole in the top of the circle and feed the string or ribbon through.
4. Tie the string or ribbon into a knot.

### What you need:

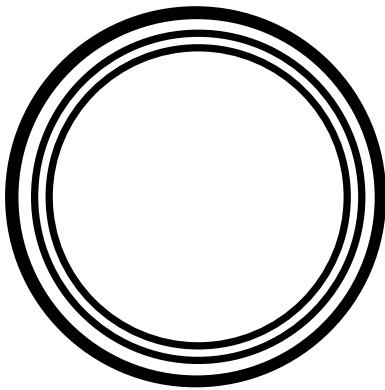
A paper plate

### What you need to do:

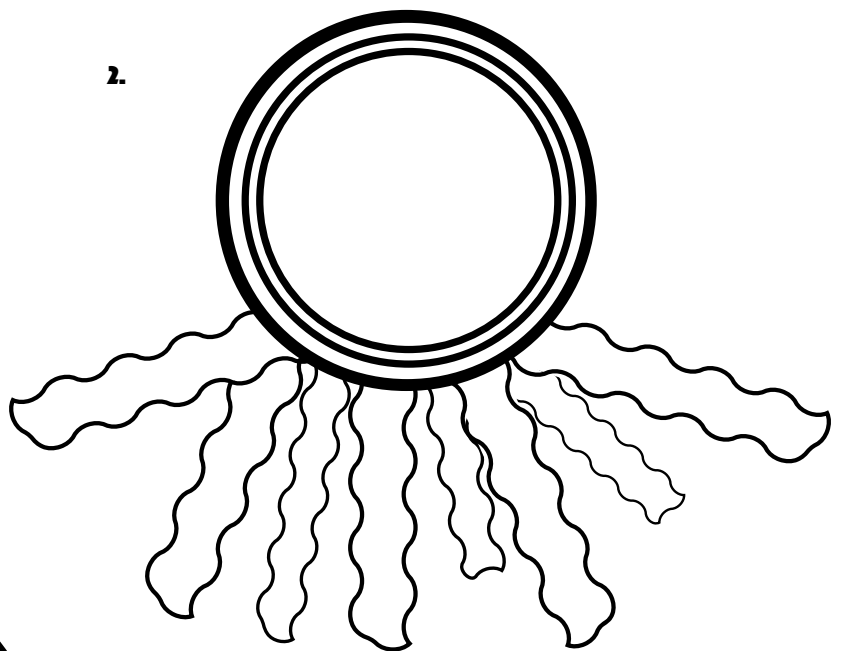
1. Use a paper plate for the head

3. Give your octopus a face and decorate!



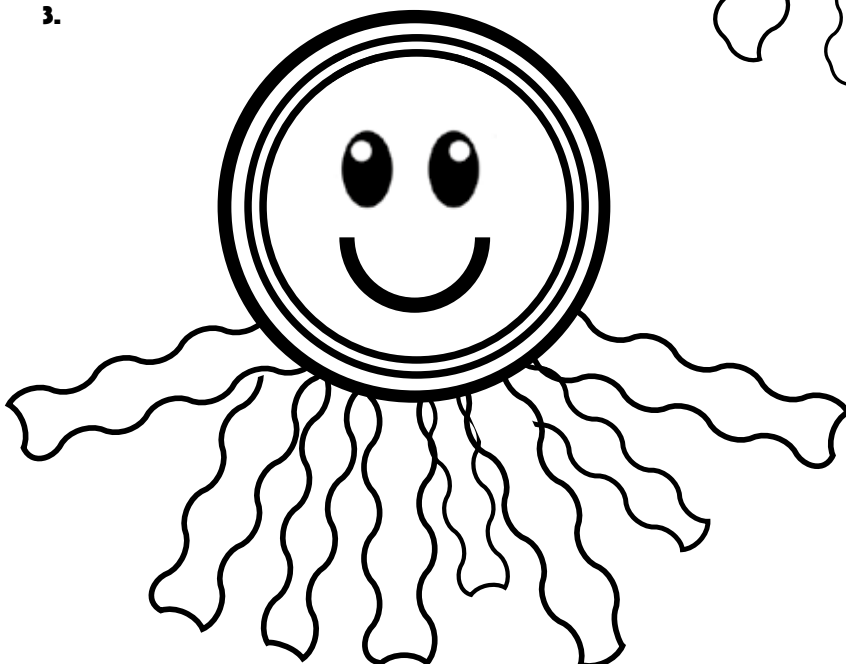

### What you need:

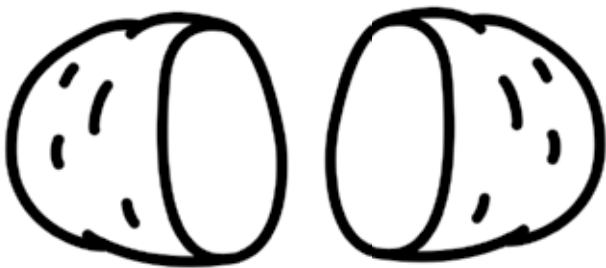
Potatoes
